(c) In a family of five, the father believes in strict discipline and rarely spends time talking with his children. The mother tries to mediate but feels unheard. The children, on the other hand, feel their opinions are ignored, leading to arguments and emotional distance. The family is financially stable but emotionally divided. Analyze the role of mutual respect and affection in restoring harmony in the family. Suggest steps each family member should take to build healthier communication.	07
