Section A

Instructions: This section has a scenario. Read carefully before answering the subsequent questions. There are 4 questions in this section. All questions are compulsory. Each question has 3 or 2 options. Choose ONLY ONE option which you consider the most appropriate and mark it on the answer sheet given to you.

Max Marks: 10

Jasmit is an Ayurvedic doctor from Kolkata who founded the Gutli Mission in 2017–18. He was deeply troubled by what he saw around him - environmental damage and paddy farmers in Bengal earning very little despite months of hard work. So, he began collecting discarded mango seeds, turning them into saplings, and giving them free to farmers as a source of long-term income.

He combined the saplings with strong local mango varieties so the trees would grow better and bear fruit faster. He also trained farmers in organic and climate-friendly farming methods. Though many farmers did not trust him at first, he kept visiting villages and launched “Tree ka Langar”, distributing free fruit trees and earning their confidence.

In 2023, a video about his work went viral. Schools, citizens, and the armed forces joined in. The mission has since received over 21 lakh seeds from across India and abroad and has distributed over 8 lakh fruit trees to more than 5,000 farmers in West Bengal.

His goal is to plant 20 crore trees across India and build what he calls a “Carbon Protection Force” - a nationwide effort to lock carbon in trees and repair the damage done to the environment. As he puts it, “true success is not just about what you achieve for yourself, it is about what you give back.”
